Public Safety Update: Revolving Door Keeps Spinning During December

Dangerous suspects continue to be routinely released from secure detention. Here is the latest example of how the misuse of community corrections and bail is endangering the public:

During December, 2009, the following inmates were released from secure detention in King County

Work Release:

- Armin Ravani - **Robbery 1 (gun charge)** convicted, sent to work release.
- Calhoun Malik - **Rape of a Child 1.** Charged, awaiting trial. Sent to work release.
- Kenneth Whiteman - **Child Molestation 1.** Convicted, sent to Work Release.
- Setefano Gilbert - **DV Child Assault 1** Charged, awaiting trial.
- Douglas Sheets - **Manslaughter 2** Convicted and sent to work release.
- Collin Irons- **Felon Assault 3** - Escaped work release-recaptured sent to jail.

- Latisha Perkins - **Robbery 1 (gun charge)**-charged awaiting trial - sent to work release.

Electronic Home Detention:

- John Ingram - **Drive by Shooting** - sent to EHD- charged awaiting trial. State requested warrant for \$250,000 because defendant likely to commit a violent offense. Accused of being the driver of a drive by shooting and evaded prosecution for six months.
- Jaffer Ali - **Vehicular Homicide** - Hit and Run - charged awaiting trial
- Ayesha Barquet -**Robbery 1 (gun charge)** - charged awaiting trial
- Yusef Abdisalam - **FTA/robbery 1st degree** – FTA (failed to Appear....indicating he was allowed to bail out and did not come back) Charged, awaiting trial.
- John Elgin - **Rape of a Child 2nd**. State believes defendant is a danger to children and cause concern for community safety. charged awaiting trial
- Paul Austin - **Child Molestation in the 2nd Degree & Child Molestation in 3rd Degree**. Charged awaiting trial
- Edward Walker - **Attempted Robbery x2** - In one count he punched victim in face and stole wallet - convicted and serving sentence in Home detention

And finally:

On December 30, 2009, Jermaine Route was arrested for robbery. On the 31st he posted a \$100,000 bond and was released. On January 9, Route was arrested on suspicion of robbery, rape, and kidnapping.

His new bail was set at \$500,000.

We remain frustrated that suspects charged with and convicted of violent crimes continue to be released from jail. We call on state and county authorities to put safety first and stop the release of dangerous individuals.
